

Materials Needed:

	Baby	Lap	Picnic	Twin	Queen
Quilt Size	48" x 48"	48" x 72"	72" x 72"	72" x 96"	96" x 96"
Block Count	4	6	9	12	16
Print Fabric	1 Charm Pack or (24) 5" Squares	1 Charm Pack or (36) 5" Squares	2 Charm Packs or (54) 5" Squares	2 Charm Packs or (72) 5" Squares	3 Charm Packs or (96) 5" Squares
Background Fabric	2 Yards	3 Yards	4 1/2 Yards	5 3/4 Yards	7 3/4 Yards
Binding	1/2 Yard	5/8 Yard	2/3 Yard	2/3 Yard	3/4 Yard
Backing	3 Yards	3 Yards	4 1/2 Yards	6 Yards	9 Yards


Cutting Instructions – Background Fabrics

- From the Background Fabric cut according to the following diagram.

Background	Baby	Lap	Picnic	Twin	Queen
8 1/2" x 8 1/2" Square	16	24	36	48	64
5" x 5" Square	24	36	54	72	96
4 1/2" x 4 1/2" Square	32	48	72	96	128

Piecing Units – Half Square Triangle Unit

- Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of a Print 5" x 5" square.
- Place the marked square on a Background 5" x 5" square with right sides together, aligning the raw edges.
- Sew a 1/4" seam on either side of the marked line. Cut on the marked line to create 2 units. Press both seams towards the Print fabric.



- Repeat to create the designated number of Half Square Triangle Units


Baby	Lap	Picnic	Twin	Queen
48 from 24 sets	72 from 36 sets	108 from 54 sets	144 from 72 sets	192 from 96 sets

- Trim all the Half Square Triangle Units to measure 4 1/2" x 4 1/2".

Piecing Units – Corner Unit

- Layout 2 Half Square Triangle Units and 2 Background 4 1/2" x 4 1/2" squares as shown.
 - Sew the units together into two rows. Press the seams towards the Background squares.
 - Sew the two rows together. Press the seam open.




- Repeat to create the designated number of Corner Units.

Piecing Units – Center Unit

- Layout 4 Half Square Triangle Units as shown.
 - Sew the units together into two rows. Press the seams open.
 - Sew the two rows together. Press the seam open.




- Repeat to create the designated number of Center Units.

Piecing the Block

1. Layout 4 Corner Units, 1 Center Unit, and 4 Background $8\frac{1}{2}'' \times 8\frac{1}{2}''$ squares as shown.
 - a. Sew the units together into three rows. Press the seams towards the Background squares.
 - b. Sew the three rows together. Press the seam open.



2. Repeat to create the designated number of Blocks.



Sewing the Quilt Top Instructions

1. Layout the Blocks in the designated layout rearranging blocks until the color layout is pleasing to the eye.

Baby	Lap	Picnic	Twin	Queen
2 x 2	2 x 3	3 x 3	3 x 4	4 x 4

2. Sew the Blocks into rows. Press the seams open.
3. Sew the rows together to complete the quilt top. Press the seams open.



Finishing Instructions

1. Create the quilt backing.


Baby – Cut backing into 2 pieces $54'' \times \text{WOF}$
 Lap – Cut backing into 2 pieces $54'' \times \text{WOF}$
 Picnic – Cut backing into 2 pieces $81'' \times \text{WOF}$
 Twin – Cut backing into 2 pieces $108'' \times \text{WOF}$
 Queen – Cut backing into 3 pieces $108'' \times \text{WOF}$
 ** Remove selvages and piece together with a $\frac{1}{2}''$ seam allowances

2. Layer the backing, batting, and the quilt top. Baste.
3. Quilt as desired. Trim the excess batting and backing.
4. Cut the binding strips at $2\frac{1}{2}'' \times \text{WOF}$ and piece the binding strip together.


Baby	Lap	Picnic	Twin	Queen

5. Bind the quilt.



 $96'' \times 96''$




Picnic
